CODE OF CONDUCT – PARENTS AND CARERS

As parents and carers you are expected to:

- Positively reinforce your child's learning from Real FC and show an interest in their football.
- Do not place your child under any pressure (Try to relive any, rather than build pressure).
- Place their enjoyment, development and progress ahead of anything else including winning.
- Promote your child's participation in playing football for fun (That's when they'll be at their best!).
- Deliver and collect your child punctually before and after sessions/matches etc.
- Ensure the Club is kept up to date with all contact details and any changes from your registration.
- Be realistic and supportive.
- Encourage your child to play by the rules and be respectful to all involved.
- Behave responsibly on the sideline at matches and training. At training we wouldn't expect to hear anything from any parents at the sidelines, at matches only positive encouragement to your child and his/her teammates, no instruction or negative remarks.
- Keep up to date with their subscriptions and other payments.
- Replace any of their child's kit that is lost or damaged via the Club Macron store.
- Support the Club throughout the season.
- Handle any issues in the correct manner – approach the staff in the right way and they will do their best to handle and settle any problems.
- Show respect to all others involved in the game and promote fair play and high standards of behaviour.
- Do your best to attend social events and get your young players to their events in and outside of football to help build the Club atmosphere and one we all wish to be a part of.
- Never engage in, or tolerate, offensive, insulting, or abusive language or behaviour
- Remain behind the touchline and within the Designated Spectators' Area (where provided)

As parents and carers you have the right to:

- Be informed of problems or concerns relating to your children.
- Be informed if your child is injured.
- Have any concerns about any aspect of your child's welfare listened to and responded to.
- Be assured that your child is safeguarded during their participation in sport.

Any minor misdemeanours and general misbehaviour will be dealt with immediately and reported verbally to the designated person. Serious or persistent breach of the code will result in you being asked not to attend training/matches and could lead to dismissal from the Club. There is no appeal procedure to a dismissal.
